HOME SAFE HOME:

- Remove from the porch and front yard anything a child could trip over such as garden hoses, toys, bikes, and lawn decorations.
- Check outdoor lights and replace burned-out bulbs.
- Sweep sidewalks and steps clear of wet leaves or snow.
- Restrain pets so they do not jump on or bite trick-or-treaters.

ON THE TRICK-OR-TREAT TRAIL:

- A parent or responsible adult should always accompany young children.
- Only go to homes with a porch light on, and never enter a home or car for a treat.
- Older children should stay in a group and communicate where they will be going.
- Remember reflective tape for costumes and trick-or-treat bags.
- Carry a cell phone for quick communication.
- Remain on well-lit streets and always use the sidewalk. If no sidewalk is available, walk at the far edge of the roadway facing traffic.
- Never cut across yards or alleys.
- Watch for cars when crossing the street. Don't assume the right of way.
- Law enforcement authorities should be notified immediately of any suspicious or unlawful activity.

ANIMAL ETIQUETTE

-Animals must be on a leash at all times while in public places and not allowed to roam freely. **Please keep your dog on a leash or dog-run when letting them out to do their business.**

- Cats should be kept indoors, or secured outside by a collar and a leash. Unattended animals are subject to capture and removal.

-Animal waste must be picked up immediately from sidewalks, streets, and non-owner yards and disposed of in proper waste containers. Cats should use an indoor litter box.

-Dog waste stations with bags and waste containers for your convenience are placed at
Buttermore Park on 3rd Avenue
Gratty Park on Gross Street
Ball Field at South Gross Street

Borough Permits are required for:

- Fences, sheds, garages/carports and swimming pools
- Porches and decks with roofs
- Decks that are 31" or more above ground level
- Retaining walls higher than 47"
- Dumpsters placed on the Borough streets
- Door-to-door soliciting (religious and political activities are exempt)
- Temporary signs – you also must have permission from the property owner to place a sign if it is not on your property. It is illegal to post signs on telephone/streetlight poles per PA State laws.

This list is not all-inclusive.

Other permits may be necessary.

Please contact the Borough Secretary's Office before any building project is started.

WHEN CUTTING YOUR GRASS

PLEASE REMEMBER:

- Grass is not to exceed six (6) inches in height.
- Grass clippings are defined as refuse, and are NOT to be blown into the street, and are NOT to be swept down into the storm drains.
- Do not dump bags of grass onto vacant properties, or onto mulch piles. Rotting grass in the summer produces a noxious odor and is a violation of the nuisance ordinance, which is punishable by a fine.

Leaf Collection

Will begin the week of October 15 and last through December 7, WEATHER PERMITTING.

Downtown pickup will be Tuesdays,
Uptown on Wednesdays

Guidelines:

- Leaves only - must be swept into the curb
-no trash or sticks.
- Please put leaf piles into the street no sooner than 24 hours before scheduled pick up. Leaves blown about the streets or underneath parked cars will not be picked up.
- Leaves may be placed into paper (not plastic!) leaf bags and placed at the curb for pick up on scheduled dates. Bags are available at any local hardware store.

STREETS AND SIDEWALKS

- The owner or owners of property or properties in front of which sidewalks have been laid shall at all times maintain and repair said sidewalks and keep the sidewalks and the space between the curb and the property line in front of their property or properties clean and clear from all dirt, rubbish, garbage, refuse matter, brush, encroachments or obstructions, etc., of whatsoever nature and kind.

Conway Residents are reminded that **snow and ice is to be removed from their sidewalks immediately after, and not later than within 24 hours after snowfall.**

Sidewalks shall be kept open and unobstructed at all times to the public.

Please use off-street parking during snowstorms so that the roads may be plowed thoroughly.

PennDOT and the Borough of Conway urge residents to:

- Never shovel snow onto public roads.
- Shovel snow away from roadway, not toward it.
- Be cautious when working near a roadway.
- When clearing the end of the driveway, place snow to the right to prevent it from being plowed back into the driveway.
- Do not pile snow in areas that will block or obscure a driver's view of the roadway and oncoming vehicles.
- Keep children away from the roadway. Parents and guardians should keep their children from playing on snow piles near the roadway that could be plowed during snow removal operations.
